

**Simone Borghesi** is Associate Professor at the University of Siena where he teaches Environmental Economics. He received a M.Sc. in Economics at University College London (1996) and a Ph.D. in Economics at the European University Institute (2001). He worked at the International Monetary Fund, Washington (1998), at the Fondazione ENI Enrico Mattei, Milan (1999) and as Assistant Professor at the University of Pescara (2004-2008). He has published three books (“*La sostenibilità dello sviluppo globale*”, Carocci 2005, “*Global Sustainability*” Palgrave-Macmillan, 2008, both with Alessandro Vercelli; “*The EU ETS and Its Followers*”, Springer 2016, with Massimiliano Montini and Alessandra Barreca) and articles in edited books and peer-reviewed international journals including *Ecological Economics*, *Ecological Modelling*, *Ecological Indicators*, *Economic Modelling*, *Economics of Innovation and New Technology*, *Environmental Science and Policy*, *Journal of Economic Surveys*, *Journal of Evolutionary Economics*, *Journal of Socio-Economics*, *Research Policy*. He has given lectures and seminars in many cities both in Italy and abroad, including Beijing, Nice, London, Prague, New York, Zurich, Aix-en-Provence, Marseille. In 2012 he was invited at the United Nations at the High-Level Meeting on “*Happiness and Wellbeing: Defining A New Economic Paradigm*” and as invited speaker at the IV World EcoSummit (Columbus, Ohio). In the period 2012-2016 he has been member of several European projects (*Transworld*, *Cecilia*, *Fessud*) and Scientific Coordinator of the research unit of the University of Siena for the project on *Climate change in the Mediterranean area* financed by the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research among the Research Projects of National Interest (PRIN). He is currently Codirector of the research group R4S (Regulation for Sustainability) and member of the Board of Directors of the University of Siena for the United Nations MED Solutions, the regional hub for the Mediterranean of the *Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN)* directed by Jeffrey Sachs. In February 2015 he has been elected President of the Italian Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (IAERE). His main research areas are globalisation and sustainable development, economic growth, environmental degradation and well-being, European environmental policies, emission trading, dynamic environmental models, game theoretical models.
